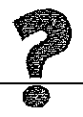

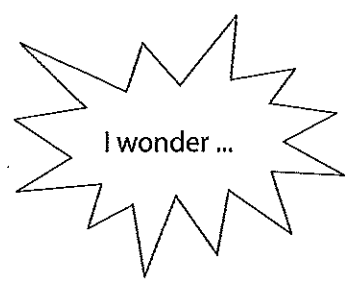

What are some questions you would like to ask the author or the characters in the book?

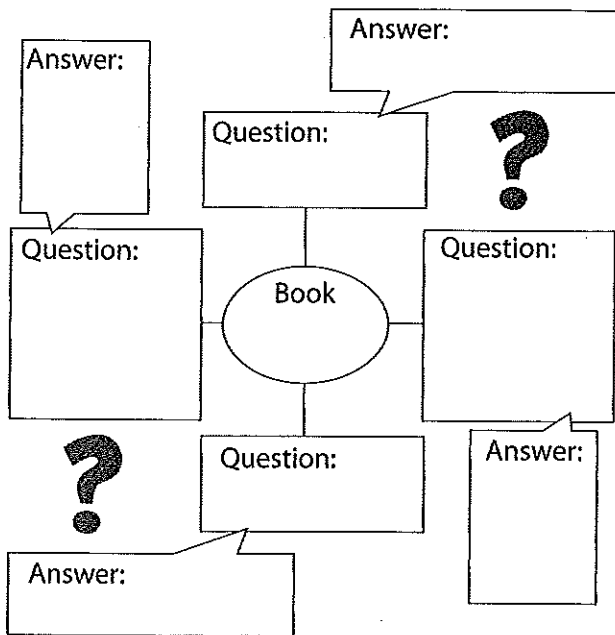
Questioning Using a Web

Questioning Ravin' Reporter

Questioning Letter to the Author


Write a brief letter to the author asking him/her to answer some questions that you have about the book. For example, you may be wondering why he/she chose a certain setting, or why a character behaves in a specific way, or about an issue that remains unresolved and seems confusing.



Questioning for Further Inquiry

Write a new question that you have now that you would like to research further.
