Heather and the Baby Kangaroo

Katie flies to Atlanta, Georgia, for her summer vacation. She stays with her father and his family. She finds out that her stepsister Heather volunteers, or works for free, at the Kangaroo Center. Katie goes with Heather to the center to help care for a baby kangaroo named Zach. Read Katie's story to find out what happens when Zach becomes sick. Then answer the questions that follow.



Heather and the Baby Kangaroo

- 1 "We are about to land the plane," the pilot said. This was my first trip to my father's new house. He lives with my stepmother and my stepsister Heather.
- I walked into the airport. I saw my father, my stepmother, and Heather. "What does she have on her head now?" I said. "Why can't she just be like everyone else?" Heather had on a cowboy hat. It looked strange on her.
- 3 Next we drove to Dad's house. We went by tall buildings. I was not listening as Dad talked to me. Then I heard him say, "Katie, it would be interesting for you to go along with Heather."
- I did not know what Dad was talking about. My face turned red. I tried to hide that I had not been listening. Soon I knew what Dad was talking about. I could not believe Heather worked for free as a volunteer.
- 5 Heather asked, "Do you want to work with me today?"
- 6 "O.K.," I said. I was not happy, but I smiled anyway.

- 11 A woman came up to us. Heather said, "Hi, Britt. This is my stepsister Katie. She will work with me this summer."
- "Hi, Katie. It is nice to have you here," Britt said. "But I have some bad news, Heather. Your baby kangaroo Zach is not doing well."
- "What is wrong?" Heather asked in an upset voice. "He was fine when I was here Tuesday."
- "We do not know," Britt said. "We are waiting for the doctor."
- "Can I see him, please?" Heather asked, almost begging.
- We went with Britt to a room for sick kangaroos. Zach was the only kangaroo there. He looked very small and sick.



- 23 The doctor said, "You will have to feed him smaller <u>quantities</u> of milk. Also, you will have to feed him more than four times a day. Zach should be fine in a few days."
- 24 "Do you hear that, Zach?" Heather asked. "You are going to be just fine."
- I watched Heather pet Zach. I think one day she might become a doctor who takes care of animals. With Heather, you never know what she will do next. But I saw the way she took care of Zach. This may be one thing she does for the rest of her life.




Best Friends?

This is a story about two boys, Rod and Bryan, who are best friends. Rod is wondering whether he still wants to be Bryan's friend because Bryan is being a bully to other students. In class Bryan tries to get a boy named Jordan into trouble. And later in the cafeteria, Bryan is mean to Jordan. Now read the story to find out how Rod reacts to Bryan's behavior. Then answer the questions that follow.

Best Friends?

- 1 Rod did not want to be friends with Bryan anymore. Rod and Bryan had been best friends for a long time. But now Bryan was being a bully to other kids. Rod did not like it.
- 2 One day at school Bryan sent Rod a note. "I can make Jordan do anything I tell him to do! Watch this."
- Jordan's desk was in front of Bryan's. Bryan threw his pen on the floor when the teacher was not looking. The pen was next to Jordan's desk. - "Wow!" Jake said. "I am so glad. I do not want to ride it either. I thought you would make fun of me. We have always talked about riding the Zipper. But I am scared."

Just This Once



- 3 Lindsay did not want to say that she had better grades than Shannon. Math was hard for Shannon. She had also missed three days of class last week. Lindsay started to say she was sorry. Then Shannon put the homework into her notebook.
- "Just this once," Shannon said. "But promise not to tell anyone."

- "That is funny," the teacher said. "Shannon also thinks that a cube has four faces. But that is the wrong answer. A cube has six faces. One of you copied the other person's homework. This is very bad."
